RESOLUTION NO. 22-34**

**A RESOLUTION AMENDING SECTIONS 2 and 19 OF RESOLUTION NO. 95-11
RELATING TO VACCINATION OF ANIMALS AND PENALTIES**

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Park County (the “Board”) previously adopted Resolution No. 95-11, the “Park County Animal Control Resolution of 1995;” and

WHEREAS, recent legislation has updated the laws related to animal vaccination and misdemeanor penalties; and

WHEREAS, the Board wishes to amend the Park County Animal Control Resolution of 1995 to conform to current law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PARK COUNTY:

Section 1. Section 2(ae) of the Park County Animal Control Resolution of 1995 is hereby amended to read as follows:

- ae. “Vaccination” and “Vaccination for Rabies” each mean the inoculation of an animal with an anti-rabies vaccine approved by the Colorado State Department of Health and administered by a licensed veterinarian for use in the prevention of rabies which is deemed current by reference to the expiration date noted on the vaccine by the manufacturer. “Vaccination” and “Vaccination for Rabies” also means inoculation by a person working on behalf of an animal shelter administering to animal shelter-owned animals a rabies vaccine (deemed current by the reference to the expiration date noted on the vaccine by the manufacturer) if the person is under the indirect supervision of a licensed veterinarian and has been trained in rabies vaccine storage, handling, and administration and in the management of adverse events.

Section 2. Section 19(a) of the Park County Animal Control Resolution of 1995 is hereby amended to read as follows:

19. Penalties and Procedures:


- a. Any violation of any provision of this resolution, which did not result in bodily injury to any person shall be a petty offense and punishable upon conviction buy a fine of not more than three hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the county jail for not more than ten days, or by both such fine and imprisonment for each separate offense. When a person is charged with violation of this resolution, which did not result in bodily injury to any person, the arresting officers may follow the penalty assessment procedure provided in § 16-2-201, C.R.S. as amended provided that:

1. The defendant has not been convicted on more than one previous occasion of any violation of this resolution, any previous County resolution concerning dog control and animal control, or any state laws concerning dogs or animals other than wildlife; and
2. The charged offense does not concern a dangerous dog, a potentially dangerous dog, an animal that was destroyed or euthanized, or an offense which requires a mandatory court appearance by the terms of this resolution.
