**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PARK
COUNTY, COLORADO, ALTERING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE COUNTY
COMMISSIONER DISTRICTS PURSUANT TO C.R.S. § 30-10-306**

WHEREAS, pursuant to C.R.S. § 30-10-306(4), after each federal census of the United States, the Board of County Commissioners (the “Board”) is required to establish, alter, or revise each commissioner district boundary to assure that such district is as nearly equal in population based on such census minus the number of persons serving a sentence of detention or confinement in any correctional facility in the county;

WHEREAS, as required by C.R.S. § 30-10-306(5), the Board has held a public hearing on the proposed change in commissioner district boundaries;

WHEREAS, in preparing the new commissioner district boundaries, the Board received and considered the results of the 2020 United States Census;

WHEREAS, in preparing the new commissioner district boundaries, the Board has considered the constitutional apportionment of requirement of “one person – one vote,” or population equality;

WHEREAS, in preparing the new commissioner district boundaries, the Board has ensured that the new boundaries will not result in minority vote dilution or political gerrymandering;

WHEREAS, there will be a no more than five percent deviation between the most populous and least populous district in the county once the proposed district boundaries are adopted;

WHEREAS, in preparing the new commissioner district boundaries, the Board has ensured that the districts are compact and numbered consecutively;

WHEREAS, in preparing the new commissioner district boundaries, the Board has attempted to preserve communities of interest within the districts;

WHEREAS, the redistricting plan will not result in a change of residence of any of the current commissioners; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds and determines that it is in the best interest of public health, safety, and welfare to change the boundaries of the commissioner districts as set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Park County that:

1. The boundaries of the commissioner districts of Park County, Colorado are hereby altered as depicted in the district map attached hereto as **Exhibit A** and incorporated herein by this reference, and as more fully described in **Exhibit B** attached hereto and also incorporated herein by reference.



EXHIBIT B

District 1 Commissioner Boundary:

Bounded on North by US HWY 285 and Roland Dr to Brookside Dr; on the West by County Road 77 and County Road 23 to the intersection of US HWY 24; to the intersection of US HWY 24 and SH 9; to the intersection of CR 108 and CR 107 to the intersection of CR 53; bounded on the South by Freemont County line; and East by Jefferson County.

District 2 Commissioner Boundary:

Bounded on North by Clear Creek County and Summit County; on the East by Jefferson County; South by US HWY 285; and West by CR 62.

District 3 Commissioner Boundary:

Bounded on North by Clear Creek County and Summit County; on the West by Lake and Chaffee Counties; on the South by Freemont County; on the East by CR 77, CR 23, US HWY 24, SH 9, CR 53, CR 108, and CR 107.
