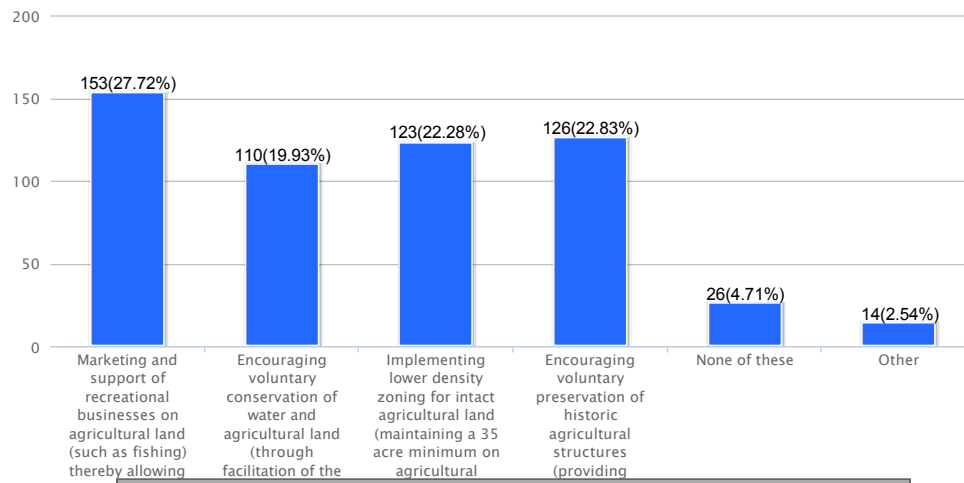

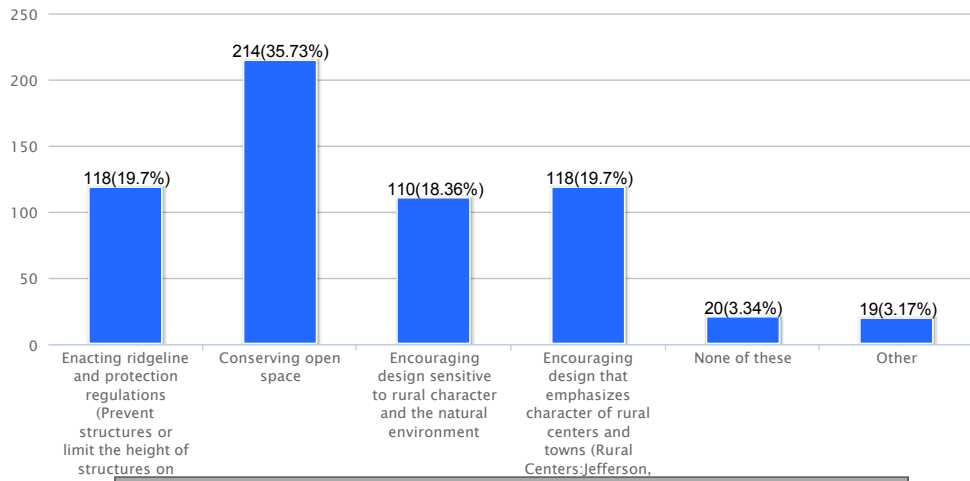

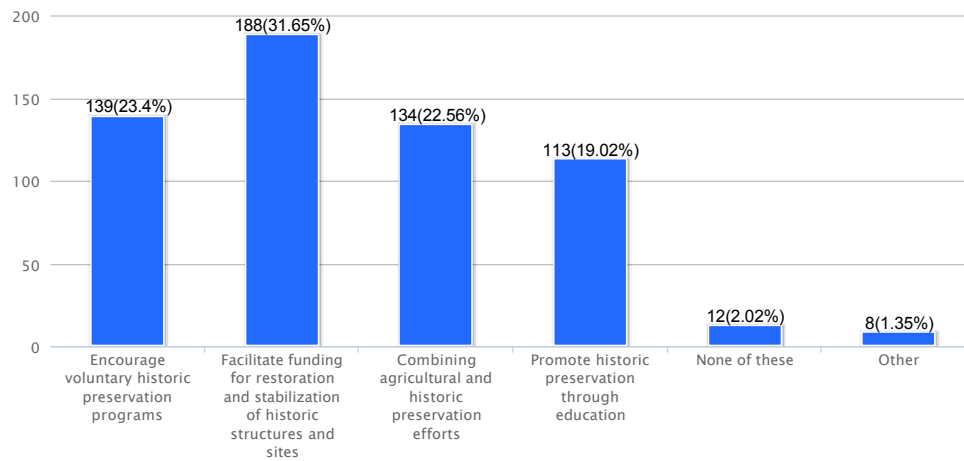

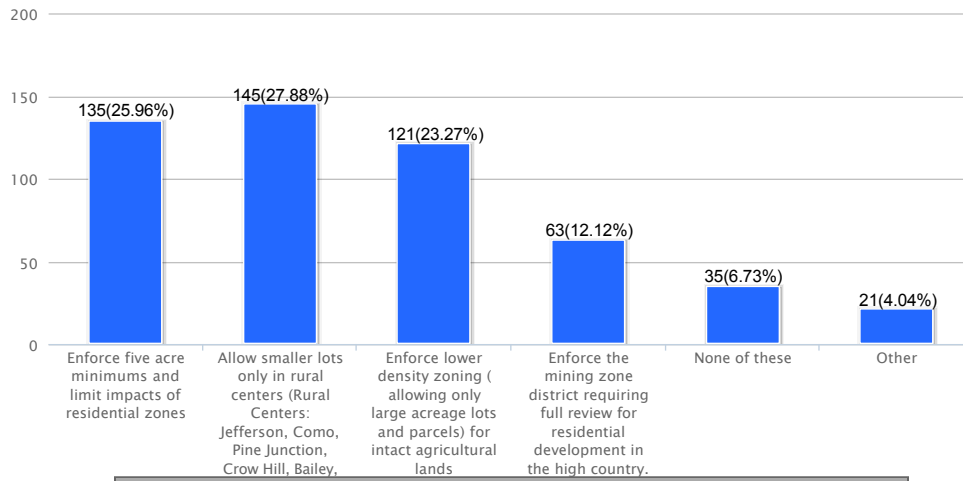

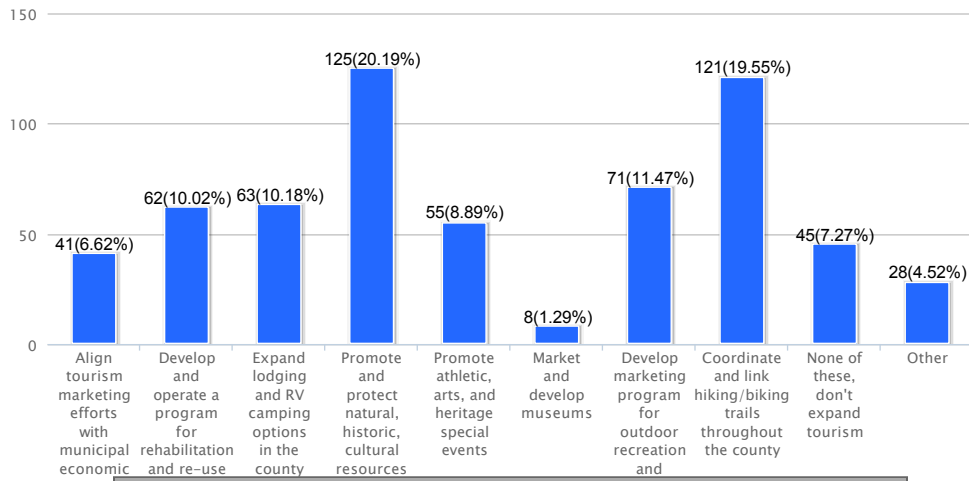

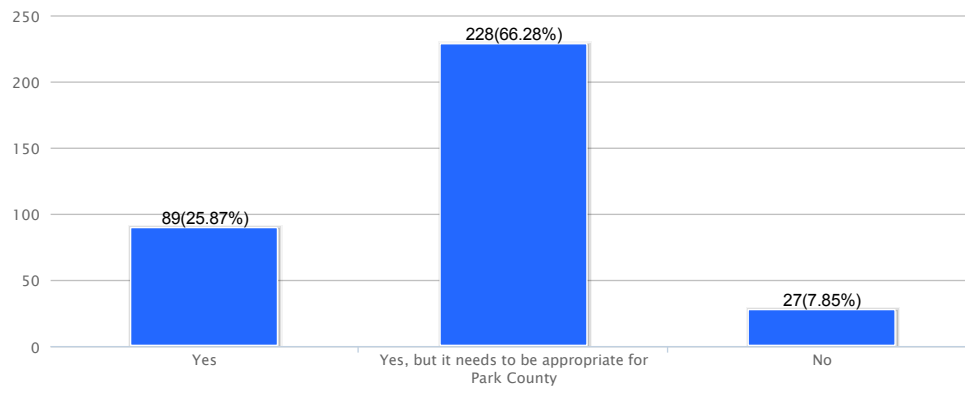

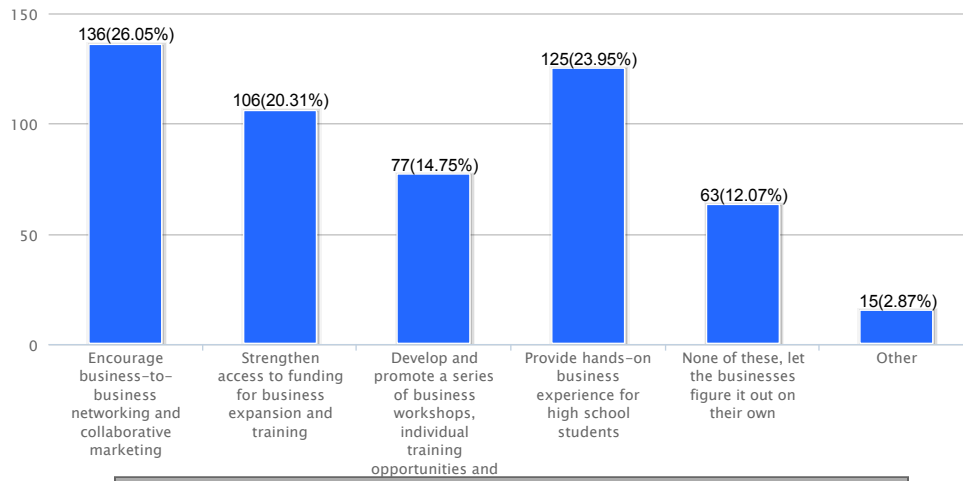

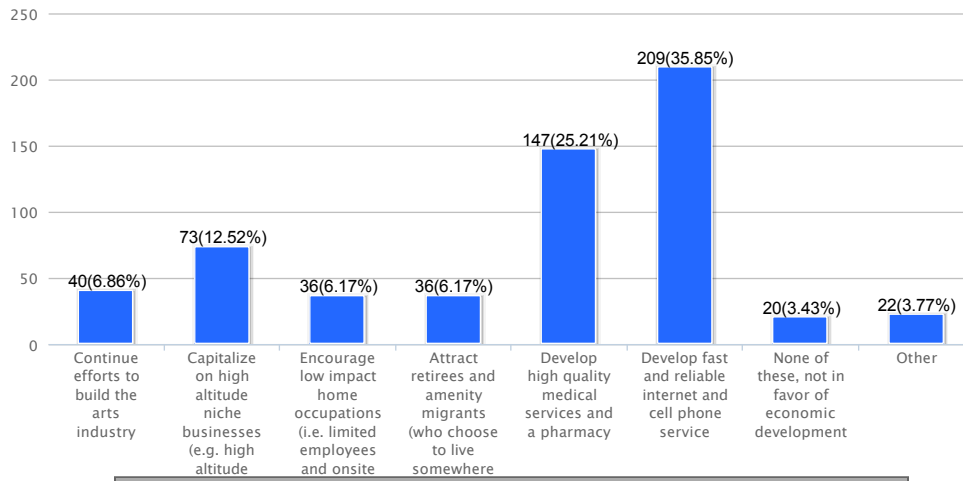

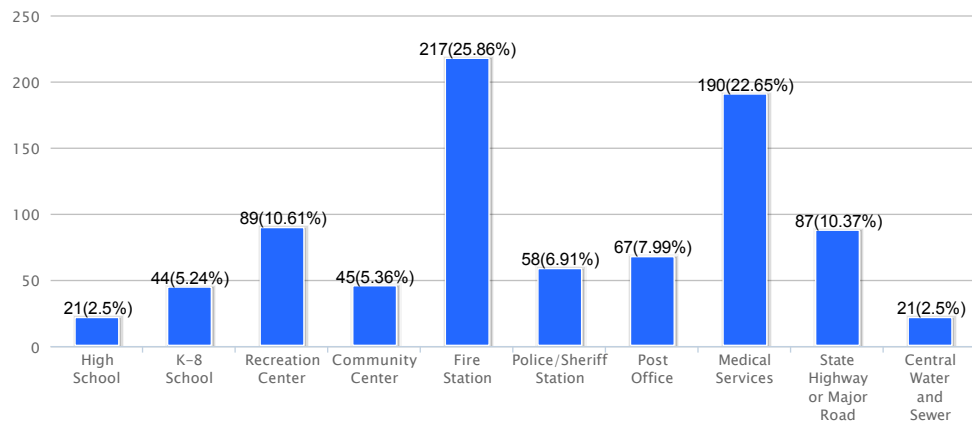

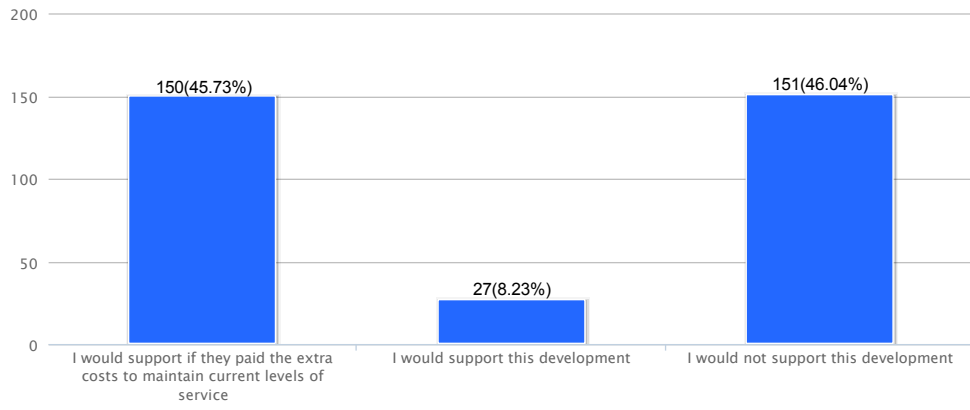

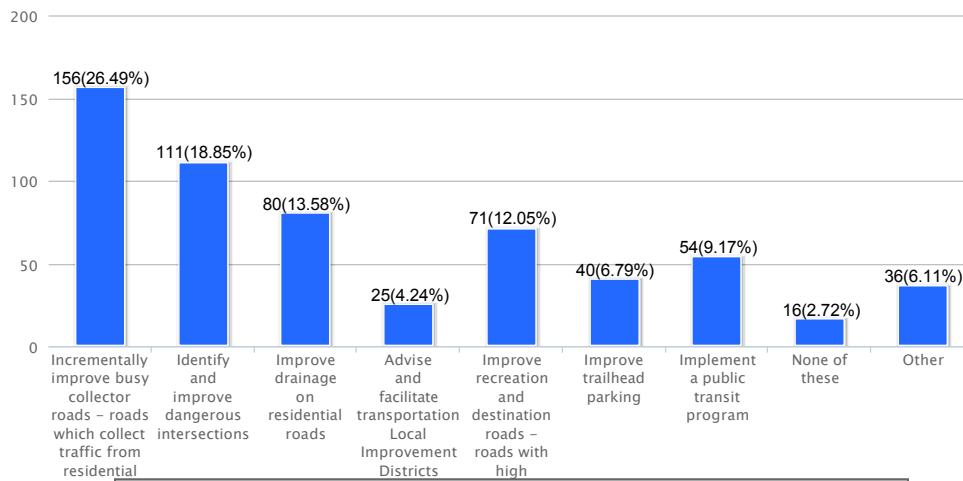

If a proposed development adversely affects public services (reduces your Level of Service), would you support  



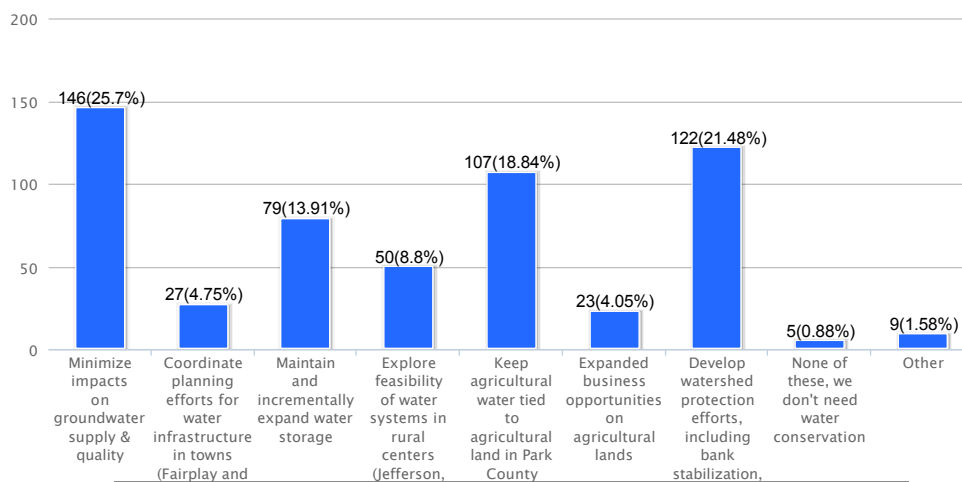

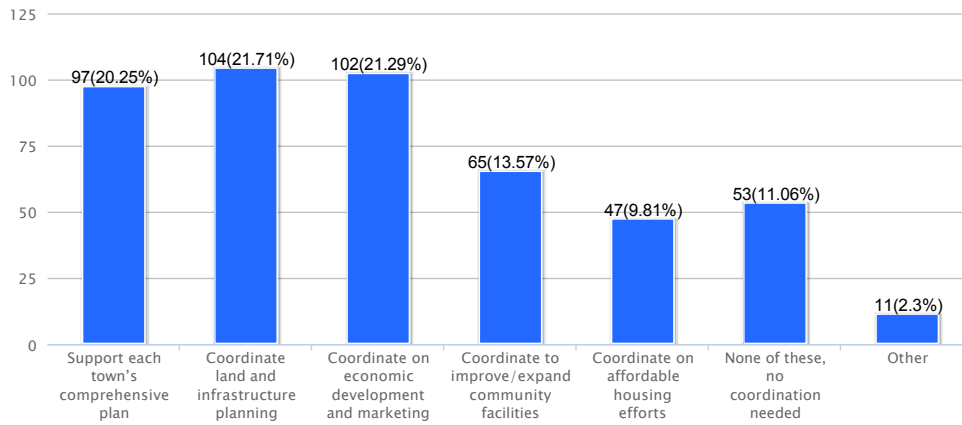

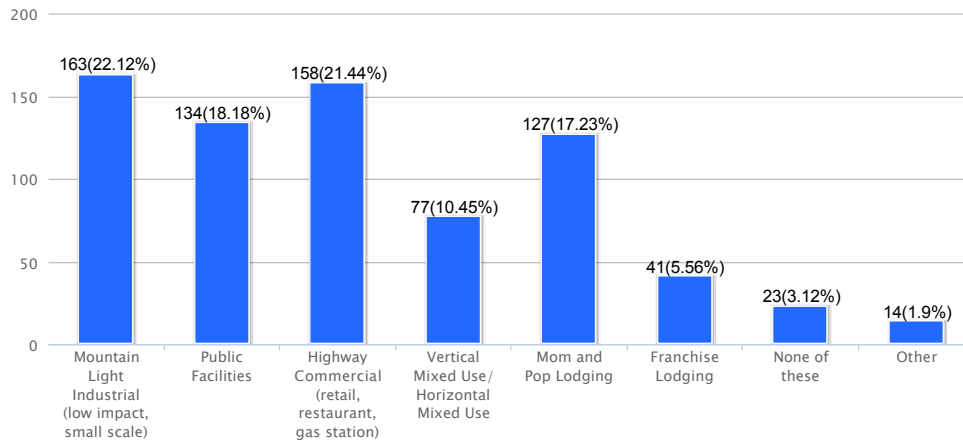
